# Representative Raúl M. Grijalva (D-AZ) Co-Chair of Congressional Progressive Caucus

Congressman Raúl M Grijalva, is serving his 4<sup>th</sup> term in Congress. A native of Tucson, Arizona and son of a *bracero*, Congressman Grijalva has been advocating for his community's needs for more than 30 years.

Before entering Congress, Congressman Grijalva served as Pima County Supervisor and Tucson Unified School District Board member where he rose to chairman of both bodies. His political career stemmed from his advocacy during the Chicano Movement, striving to ensure that parks, health centers, and schools were accessible and in locations to serve all members of the community.

Congressman Grijalva serves on the Education and Labor Committee and Committee on Natural Resources. Congressman Grijalva was recently elected as co-chair of the Congressional Progressive Caucus where his work prioritizes reinvesting in community infrastructure in the United States, our public education system, an alternative energy green jobs creation initiative, equity in education, and pursuing comprehensive, humane immigration reform. In addition, he has been an outspoken critic of the war in Iraq.

On the national level, Congressman Grijalva has been a consistent leader on environmental issues. He currently serves as Chairman of the House Natural Resources Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests and Public Lands. As Chairman of the Subcommittee, Congressman Grijalva championed efforts to advance the National Landscape Preservation System, protect wilderness areas, protect endangered species, and advance the National Parks Service Centennial Initiative. Most recently, he worked to protect the Grand Canyon from the threat of expanded uranium mining, advance ecological restoration on Federal lands, and address the need for a budget fix for wildland fire suppression funding.

### **Obama's former online org leader/Facebook co-founder**

Chris Hughes has spent his brief career developing technologies that make it easier for people to communicate and self-organize. After co-founding Facebook in 2004, Hughes worked first as the site's spokesperson and later as a product manager specializing in user experience. In 2007, Hughes left Facebook to work on Barack Obama's presidential campaign as the Director of Online Organizing, where he was charged with developing online tools to engage and empower supporters to network and self-organize. Hughes oversaw the development of the on-site network My.BarackObama.com along with the campaign's presence on other networks like Facebook and MySpace. In 2006, Hughes graduated magna cum laude from Harvard with a degree in History and Literature.
